## **Top Gun Report**

I got this report via email from Dennis Friesel on the Top Gun competition. Thanks Dennis & congratulations to you & Michael on a job well done.

Mike and I made it through 3 rounds of Prom Am flying at Top Gun with the PBM, in spite of 14 to 18 mph, 90 degree crosswinds on all three days. The winds were gusting to 25 mph, blowing over chairs and tents, but we managed to keep the plane in one piece for four flights (one practice and 3 rounds of competition). The PBM can take off in high crosswinds, on one wheel and a float. Thank goodness for the floats or I never would have gotten off the ground. The struts are really strong and did not bend under the strain. The PBM doesn't go wings level until you have enough air speed to allow the ailerons to work at full throw, and this occurs at just about takeoff speed. Not good for getting points on takeoff, but good enough to get the plane airborne for the other 9 maneuvers. My landings weren't great either, but not fatal. The main gear survived the beating, but I had to repair the nose gear after 2 rounds. I was not alone in this exercise. The plane flew great in the air



however, and I got good scores on the airborne maneuvers. I didn't make the cut to fly on Sunday however, but placed 14th out of 24 entrants, of which 22 showed up. We also learned that the PBM can stay airborne for over 10 minutes with battery capacity to spare. My longest routine was 7 minutes, takeoff to landing, but used only 4 Amp hrs. out of the 9.6 available. Flight line control was not the best either. On one flight I was setting up for landing when a jet took the runway for takeoff in front of me. I went around to set up again and was on short final when he finally took off. One poor fellow crashed his plane because they kept him airborne while clearing the runway so long he ran out of gas. Several planes were lost for various reasons (Winds (several), Mid Air (1), & just plain folding up in flight (2)), including that fabulous Lear Jet that we all saw in Toledo. It got pummeled by the winds on take off and snapped into the ground from about 15 ft. Anyway, I've attached two pictures of the PBM at Top Gun. In one you can see the flags flying straight out. The Lakeland Airport runway wind sock (for full scale planes) was absolutely flying straight out parallel to the ground. It's amazing what you can do when you have to. By the way, Mike is an excellent caller. He did a fantastic job.
