Your wonderful friend and my loving husband passed from this world at 9:47am this morning. I was at his side holding his hand. I prayed with him and told him I loved him when he took his last breath. He is at peace now. He was a strong Christian man and heaven is rejoicing today.

I am planning to have an open house next Thursday between 10:00am and 2:pm at my home. Stop by if you can. It will be very informal. I am planning a camping trip in early October and a barbeque as a celebration of his life. I would love to have all of you come out. I will send details as I make more plans. Bruce loved the club and all you guys and he will live on in our hearts.

God bless, Leslie Bruce was very active in the club for many, many years and helped tons of members learn to fly R/C. He was a meticulous builder and an expert at covering long before the age of ARFs. Many of his creations are still being flown today.

Bruce was also the announcer for our annual club airshow & for the Hoosier Hills Airshow Team. His many talents will be greatly missed.

I personally will never forget an occasion when I had only been flying R/C for a very short time. I was on the flightline watching Bruce fly his "foam goose" and asking lots of questions about it. He just handed me the transmitter while the airplane was in mid-flight & said "Here, you ought to just try it out". I nervously flew it slowly around the pattern a couple of times & turned to give him back the radio & he was gone! Before I could panic, he hollered from across the field "It's got plenty of fuel. You can land when it runs out." **Thanks Bruce! It was a pleasure...**

Craig came to inquire about the possibility of having some club members do some flying demonstrations before a July 3rd fireworks show at the Southside Christian Church in Bloomington.

Mark reported that VP Bruce Hoffman is not doing well. He has had a fall & is now confined to a hospital bed at his home. Leslie is caring for him with the help of a part-time hospice.

Mark reported that there are fourteen gallons of 2-stroke club fuel available for sale at \$14.00 per gallon for new members & those who spaced the annual bulk fuel order.
