The April meeting of the Monroe County R/C Club started in the parking lot of Clariti Advanced Vision Correction with distribution of the annual bulk fuel order by Mark Sexton, Delbert Davis & Jim Scott. The actual business meeting started in Dr. Matt's office at 7:07:02. Thirty members were present & one visitor (Tom Liebig) came to check us out.

It was announced that Randy Byers will attempt to fill in for Bruce as the PA announcer for this year's annual club airshow. Dr. Matt Fornefeld will take over Randy's previous position as the flight-line director (pit boss).

There will not be a second club swap meet in the Fall of 2010. Everybody involved is too busy & there wasn't enough support from the club. Many thought it might hurt the attendance at our annual February event.

Better bring some insect repellent along on your next trip to the field. Those little black bugs that like to swarm in your face & bite like crazy are back again this Spring & seem to have enjoyed the Winter break. They can make it tough to keep an eye on your aircraft as they try to eat your face & neck off. The carpenter bees are in full force around the shelter too. Hard hats may be required at some point as they continue to bore holes into the roof supports.

He purchased the E-Flight T-34 with the Spektrum radio & ordered it on mode 1, which is how he learned to fly many years ago. There is no menu selection or power-on setting to change the mode, it has to be ordered the way you want it. According to the people at Horizon, you can link the transmitters with a buddy cord but whatever mode the master radio is, the slave radio becomes that same mode also. Not being coordinated enough to fly mode 1 & not wanting Bill to buddy on mode 2, I just talked him through his first couple of flights as he piloted the airplane with the master radio on mode 1. He had

been practicing on the simulator & did a fine job getting back in the air. He got a little fast & ejected his canopy but had a couple of good flights & made good landings. Congratulations Bill & welcome back into R/C!
