The October meeting of the Monroe County R/C Club got underway at 6:57:12 with twenty-five people present. Joey Clendening came to join the club & his mother came

along to visit. Joey has been coming out to trainer Tuesdays for several weeks & recently completed the requirements to earn his solo certificate. Congratulations Joey & welcome to the club!

Mark Sexton reported that the celebration of VP Bruce Hoffman's life, that was hosted by his wife Leslie at Lake Monroe, was well attended & very moving.



Joe Rogers reported that the Nebo Memorial Fall Festival Fly-In went very well & that fourteen pilots participated. A newspaper reporter from the Martinsville paper came out & took some pictures & wrote a nice piece for the Sunday edition of the newspaper.

Dennis Friesel reported that the float-fly on Lake Lemon went very well. Everyone who attended liked the location & Dennis plans to try to secure it again for another event next Summer or Fall. The kids from the Boy's Club will be invited to the club field next Summer for an introduction to R/C flight as thanks for letting us use their facility.

Dennis gave some information about a covering called Geotex that might work well on part of our runway for aircraft with wheels too small to tackle the grass. More information will be presented at a later date after Dennis has a chance to see how the covering works out at a field in Cleveland.

The club garment order was distributed & Mark says there are club hats still available for sale to those who want one.

Mark reported that the annual club airshow brought in around \$400.00. The club voted to donate all of the proceeds to the Bloomington Hospice Center.

There was a long discussion about alternatives to the airshow for public awareness of model aviation. Several members have mentioned how dangerous the airshow can be & that it might be better to have a mall show or an introductory program at the club field to invite the public to instead of an airshow. Either of those options seemed to involve less danger to the spectators. If you have any ideas or comments, please pass them along to Mark Sexton or Rick Hill. Rick is preparing a flyer to help explain the business sponsorship program. When finished it can be passed out to interested business people & posted on the club web site.

Since it's "pick on Carl" month, I'll relate a story I heard at the field. On Tuesday the 26th of October a severe thunderstorm went through Monroe County. There wasn't a lot of damage but the big wind loosened the clamps on the windsock pole at the club field. The pipe slid down & put the sock at roof level. Carl Ward discovered the damage the next day & took a ladder out to repair the pole. He removed the sock, set it on the roof, & bolted the pole back into position from the North side of the shelter.
