That kinda narrowed it down to sixty or so possibilities unless you really take that "gentleman" thing seriously.

Do not forget to rebind your Spektrum equipped aircraft after you have all the controls set properly. The fail-safe settings on Spektrum are taken from the stick settings when you bind the receiver to the transmitter. If your throttle was reversed during the first bind, it will go to full power if it

looses contact with the transmitter. It's always a good idea to test your fail-safe settings. Tie the aircraft down & shut off the transmitter while the engine or motor is running to make sure it will shut down during a fail-safe condition & not go out of control at WFO!

The little electric "Champ" that was awarded as the raffle prize at the airshow was won by new member Dave Hotz's daughter. She brought it out to "trainer nite" one Tuesday evening & got some instruction from intro pilot Joe Rogers. There was a little breeze that evening & Joe's demo flight was pretty exciting until he figured out how to put the transmitter on low rate.

We had a great time at the float-fly that Dennis Friesel hosted on Lake Lemon September 21st. It was a very nice shady site which was appreciated since we had a new record high temperature of 96 deg. for the date.
