to model aviation we gave to the Boys & Girls Club in July. Thanks Dennis!

Monroe County RC Club TAG Day, July 12, 2011.

The Monroe County RC Club, an AMA leader Club in Monroe County Indiana, teamed up with the "Boys and Girls Club of Bloomington" (Indiana) to provide a modeling experience for 65 children aged 6 to 12 years old at its flying field on Wiley Road. The Boys and Girls Club, lead by Camp Director Audrey Hall, provided 8 chaperones who divided the kids up into 4 groups. 14 Monroe County RC Club members volunteered to provide and/or set up tents, a PA system, 3 flight simulator systems for training and a DVD video system for viewing RC videos in the MCRCC club pole barn. Following a short safety talk to the children, the morning was spent making FPG9 gliders, simulator training and watching "CRASH" videos. Flight demonstrations of various model aircraft were also presented by club members during these morning activities. Of course, the "CRASH" videos were a huge hit, but the FPG9 Gliders and simulators were very close seconds.

At noon, the 6 to 9 year old children were bused to another activity in Bloomington, while 23 remaining 10 to 12 year olds stayed at the field for lunch and flight training with the buddy box system using both MCRCC and some member trainers. About 7 trainer/buddy box systems and instructor pilots were available to provide each boy and girl with an RC flight experience. Each child was given dedicated training on a flight simulator before being escorted to one of four instructor pilot/ helper teams. Each child received about 5 minutes of flight time during the afternoon session, which lasted about 2 ½ hours. While the day was quite warm (90's), several fans, pop up tents and the pole barn kept things reasonably cool, and a great time was had by all involved. Even the Boys and Girls Club chaperones wanted and were given time on the flight simulators and the trainers.

The participating MCRCC members had as much fun as the children, and all were surprised at how well the children were able to fly the RC trainers after receiving the simulator training. The MCRCC voted at its monthly club meeting to make this an annual event, as did the Board of Directors of the Boys and Girls Club of Bloomington. In return, the Boys and Girls Club has agreed to allow our club to use their excellent facilities on

Lake Lemon, Camp Rock, to host an annual "FLOAT" fly. (More on that later) We seem to have stumbled upon a mutually advantageous arrangement with the Boys and Girls Club. Below are some pictures of the Tag Day activities.
