## Interesting Bits...

Tim Sparks submitted the following information after an incident at a recent flying event. Thanks Tim!

So last Saturday I had a "hard landing" in Galveston, Indiana. My plane went in at full power 45 degrees nose down but don't worry it was cushioned as it went in by 10' tall corn about 75 yards into the planted field.

A drone was called in and its attempts to locate the scene of the landing were fruitless. The Team Prowler crew (Matt, Clint, T3)



went into the hot field in search of the wreckage.

After about an hour of search Tim Porter, T3 found the mishap site and recovered my Skyraider.

Whenever you recover an engine from a crash, NEVER turn the prop over! You don't know how much dirt and other stuff might be in the engine. This will do damage to the engine! In my case I got home and carefully removed all the dirt from the outside using a 120PSI airgun and then disassembled the engine.

Here is what I found inside the engine. There is a little bit of Indiana Corn inside the engine and some dirt. I replaced the engine bearings and bench ran the engine with no apparent loss in performance.

Lesson learned: Resist the temptation to rotate the prop by hand until it has been completely disassembled and thoroughly cleaned. Now if I can get the wood stuck between the fins out.
